Students also have to have proper, approved, equipment that fits them.</li> <li>I 200 and I 300 ICS training SEMO is going to provide the training.</li> <li>When you register for these you have to register on the SEMO Website.</li> <li>April 12,13 and 14 will be an ICS 300 at Lakewood. A report of FEMA Grants for 2004 was passed out and discussed.</li> <li>A Recap 2004 will have to be given in Feb. because of computer problems.</li> <li>Copies of Emergency Services Goals for 2005 were passed around. MCI Plan program for the County was added to the goals.</li> <li>We talked about our potential building project. Committees Reports	-R-Fire Scholarship Program was cut by \$25,000.  We were able to encumber scholarship funds for 2005 in the amount of \$32,752.79. We may be able to add some new students. The committee should do this follow-up on the performance of the program.  Julius-The majority of the students are doing well and serving their departments well.  -The 1 <sup>st</sup> Battalion Coordinator position is being posted January 21. 1 <sup>st</sup> Battalion personnel will receive a posting letter. The goal is to have a 1 <sup>st</sup> Battalion Coordinator replacement by the end of February.  Loan-Jim Shephard passed around the loan reports, with outstanding balances. Jim reported that the total loan fund value has grown. This year/2004 Panama, Brocton, Ellington and Sinclairville received loans. There are monies available from FEMA and state level that is more flexible. Get hold of your Battalion Coordinator to make changes.  Radio-Charlie reported.  The thought of programmable radios, it might be in everyone's best interest o have all radios programmed the same. Having all radios set up the same would be good.  "New Tower" is working better then expected.
