SATURDAY & SUNDAY CLASSES

School Bus Rescue: The School Bus Rescue Course provides advanced training to personnel in

the specific hazards and problems associated with performing rescues from school buses. The program focuses on many aspects of school buses including construction; safety systems; and extrication strategies.

Prerequisites: NONE Course length: 4 hours

School Bus Rescue Practical Skills: This is a practical training session which allows students to apply

concepts presented during the School Bus Rescue Course & begin to establish proficiency in related extrication skills. Students attending this course will be provided information relating to tool placement & staging, anatomy of a school bus, school bus stabilization, primary entry, secondary

entry, patient packaging & extrication and bus rollovers.

<u>Medium Structural Collapse Operations: Tools</u>: This 2-day program will familiarize the student with the

tools used in structural and excavation collapse related incidents. This is an intensive hands-on course that will be evaluated on the proper use of the

tools provided.

Prerequisite: Basic Structural Collapse Operations or Basic Trench

Collapse Concepts or Trench Rescue: Awareness Level

Course length: 16 hours

Modern Fire Behavior: This course is designed to address the cognitive knowledge aspect of NFPA 1403s

new competencies and has been titled in line with today's industry terminology. When NFPA last updated its Conducting Live Fire Training standard, several "Modern Fire Behavior" competencies were added to the original eleven. This course utilizes those required training topics as its road map and attempts to better prepare firefighters for the fire behavior they

encounter today.

Prerequisite: Firefighter 1 or equivalent

Course length: 6 hours

Non-Fire Response to Emergency Scenes (NOFRES): The course is designed for non-fire response to

emergency scenes. The target audience will be EMS, Fire Police, Auxiliary members, and any members who will never be touching the fire hose, ladder, water supply equipment or doing hazmat operations at emergency scenes. (Members that DO NOT have firefighting turnout gear) Anyone who has had any prior entry level fire training (Essentials, SSO, BEFO, FF1) does not need the information that this course provides.

The course will cover history & organization of the fire service, how to remove PPE & SCBA from downed firefighters, filling air bottles, building construction covering collapse zones, scene lighting, tools, hose & maintenance of both, fire dept. communications, FF safety, work areas, apparatus backing, OSHA compliant Haz Mat awareness, OSHA compliant fire extinguisher use & proper Emergency Scene PPE.

This is not a NYS OFPC accredited course. This course is intended to cover the minimum PESH requirements for on- scene personnel. Upon completion the student will receive a certificate of completion from Chautauqua County Emergency Services. It is the individual department's responsibility to authorize emergency scene participation.
