## Non-Fire Response to Emergency Scenes

### Full Description:

The course is designed for non-fire response to emergency scenes. The target audience will be EMS, Fire Police, Auxiliary members, and any members who will never be touching fire hose, ladders, water supply equipment or doing hazmat operations at emergency scenes. **(Members that DO NOT have firefighting turnout gear)**. The course will be six, three hours class sessions. Anyone who has had any prior entry level fire training (Essentials, SSO, BEFO, FF1) does not need the information that this course provides.

Students need to complete ICS-100 and NIMS-700, and bring a Training Authorization Letter to class 1. Students will also need to bring an **IFSTA SEVENTH EDITION** student textbook to class. There will be VERY light skills to be completed along with a final exam at the end.

The course will cover history and organization of the fire service, how to remove PPE and SCBA from downed firefighters, filling air bottles, building construction covering collapse zones, scene lighting, tools, hose and maintenance of both, fire dept. communications, FF safety, work areas, apparatus backing, OSHA compliant Haz Mat Awareness, OSHA compliant fire extinguisher use and proper Emergency Scene PPE.

**This is not a NYS OFPC accredited course.** This course is intended to cover the minimum PESH requirements for on-scene personnel. Upon completion the student will get a certificate of completion from Chautauqua County Emergency Services. It is the individual departments' responsibility to authorize emergency scene participation.
