The Tactical Emergency Casualty Care (TECC) guidelines is a set of best practice recommendations for casualty management during civilian tactical and rescue operations. TECC is an all hazards approach to medical care that can be utilized in daily responses for fire, EMS, and law enforcement. The goal of TECC is to teach readily deployable life saving interventions and point of wounding care in atypical high threat emergency responses where minutes saved can mean the difference between life or death. This 4 hour training will discuss the phases of care in a high threat environment, and provide guidance on the medical management of preventable deaths at or near the point of wounding to minimize provider risk while maximizing patient benefit. The roles and integration of fire, EMS, and law enforcement in active shooter responses including rescue task force concepts will also be covered. Non-Core CME hours will be available for participation. 4 different classes are available!
